



UNC CHARLOTTE GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS For North Carolina Community College Transfer Students

1. The following groups of transfer students will have met the University's lower division, general education requirements.
 - **Students with AA, AS, or AFA degrees**
 - **Students with AAS degrees in an approved 2 + 2 program (Note: Student must major in the program in which their degree transferred. If student changes their major then they may lose all or some of their general education credit.)**
 - **Students who have met the academic core of the North Carolina Comprehensive Articulation Agreement from a NC Community College.**
2. Students who do not meet the criteria in item one should use the outline below to meet UNC Charlotte's lower division general education requirements.

I. Development of Fundamental Skills of Inquiry (9-12 semester hours)
