**Pre-requisite requirements for Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Therapy:**

**Criteria for admission:**

1. A current unencumbered license as a Registered Respiratory Therapist in North Carolina or in the state of current employment.
2. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better from your Associate Degree program that is a CAAHEP-accredited respiratory therapy program from a regionally accredited institution.
3. Students must earn a minimum grade of “C” in all coursework taken by the end of the semester prior to the semester for which application is made.
